Course contents:	The fundamentals of effective writing and critical analysis are studied together with the building of vocabulary through analysis and discussion of passages based on various topics. Extensive practice aiming at improving students' speaking, listening, reading an writing skills is also included. In particular, the course covers the following: Definition and branches of Psychology / models and theories in Psychology Psychology in practice (professional practice, phobias, mental disorders) Dreams & personality (approaches, Freud, Jung, models of consciousness and personality) Memory (models, input-transfer-storage, long-term and short-term memory, hypnosis) Mental disorders (common myths, media & stereotypes)

Planned learning activities and teaching methods:	The course is delivered to students by means of lectures conducted by the instructor. The major method of teaching is the interactive communicative approach based on the principles of functional language learning and teaching. Audio-visual aids, class discussions, pair and group work and other communicative drills are among the instructor's tools to keep students' interest alive and elicit the maximum participation from students. Students are also encouraged to make extensive use of the Internet.
Assessment methods and criteria:	A two-method assessment is adopted. The Coursework assessment, which counts for 40% of the overall mark and includes a test, a student's portfolio, an oral presentation and student's class attendance and participation and the final examination which counts for 60% of the overall mark.
