Continuation of course Interior Design 1. The subject promotes the need of interior environments, in order to create and invent design solutions, which can be applied in real life. Included in the course is an introduction to the importance and usefulness of well founded research, methodology and the application of theoretical knowledge into practice. The course concentrates on the conceptualization and analysis of the existence and functioning of materials into three-dimensional contexts. Experimentation with design elements in two-dimensional drawings: line, texture, colour, light.
