	Clinical Teaching assessment: 10%. It is applied by daily assessment of student performance when providing personalized nursing care to individuals, families and communities, in accordance with the course's clinical goals. (Absences of up to 15% are replenished, and beyond this percentage the student fails the entire course. Students must succeed an assessment of at least 50%, otherwise the student fails the entire course.)			
	<b>Final exam: 50%.</b> The written final exam includes multiple-choice questions, short answers and open questions.
