and Objectives	The aim of the course is for the student to understand the structure and function of Constitutional Law, General Administrative Law (as a "transformer" of the Constitution), Administrative Procedure and access to Justice as well as Fundamental Rights. With this approach the course covers the whole of Public Law with a theoretical deepening in the issues of both substantive and procedural law. The aim of the course is to analyze in the students at the same time a series of case studies -special cases, always in relation to the recent jurisprudence and the legislative changes. For this reason, critical issues will be analyzed through a combined study of special cases, as well as an analysis of the relevant court decisions. Students will get in touch with the theory and practice of the Courts, in order to help as new colleagues in the first steps of their course, to understand the organization of public administration, justice, its interpretation Constitution, the meaning of "Constitutional Pluralism" but also the "effects" of the case law of the CJEU and the ECHR in national courts. On the occasion of the study of the structure of court decisions, they will acquire the required specialized knowledge for the legal judgment, but also the ability as interpreters or enforcers of the law to separate the essential and the critical from the insignificant and the legally indifferent.
