The student meets this requirement either by publishing the document or by communicating acceptance.				
Learning Outcomes	 The expected learning outcomes are the following: The cultivation in the doctoral researcher of the background knowledge, the necessary research experience, ethics and skills to become a doctoral graduate, useful and beneficial to society. The production of new knowledge with systematic research engagement in the focused interests of the program and the cultivation of research orientations in architectural practice. The promotion of research as an important tool in the service of architectural science, for the promotion of architectural practice as art and science.
