Course Purpose	<p>Survey of postgraduate subjects related to the student's research goals. This course involves an individual study (under the supervision of a counsellor-professor) on topics of common interest between the student and the professor but may, where appropriate, be extended to small study groups.</p> <p>Each doctoral student must prepare a short written proposal for the proposed doctoral research and present it orally to the competent committee. The proposal must indicate the understanding of the subject of the research, the knowledge of the relevant literature and the methodology to be used, the reference topics and the work done by the student in the field by that date.</p>				
Learning Outcomes	<p>The expected learning outcomes are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cultivating the doctoral background knowledge, research experience, ethics and skills to become a doctoral graduate useful and beneficial to society. • The production of new knowledge through systematic research into the interests of the program and the cultivation of research orientations in architectural practice. • Emphasizing research as an important tool in the service of architectural science, to elevate architectural practice as art and science. • The coordinated and planned preparation of the research background on which the doctoral dissertation will be developed.
