Course Purpose and Objectives	Throughout their doctoral studies, students are required to attend research/scientific seminars, talks and conferences. This is achieved through the six Graduate Seminar courses. To satisfy the requirements of each one of these courses the student must attend at least two talks during each semester, with a minimum of 12 talks for all seminar courses. One-day seminars account for two talks, while conferences account for two talks per day.

Course Content	<p>Seminars/conferences within the Department: The Department or the School may organize a series of seminars in order for the students to acquire the necessary knowledge on the subject of their studies.</p> <p>Presentation Days of the Research Project of the PhD Candidates: The Department or School may organize a day of presentations of the research project of its PhD candidates. The meeting is held on an annual basis and all those who have successfully passed their comprehensive examination have the right to participate. The PhD candidate must attend the meeting at least once during his / her studies. The aim is to develop a research culture and cooperation between the research community of the University, to exchange views and offer feedback/suggestions to students.</p> <p>Seminars/conferences outside the Department/University: The students may participate in conferences/seminars that are organized outside their Department/University in order to acquire relevant knowledge that will help them with their studies.</p>
