 - A certified copy of your academic degree and/or official academic transcript (if applicable)
 - The Acceptance Form, provided to you by your Admissions Officer, must be signed and returned promptly.

 - Email a passport-style photograph to studies@frederick.ac.cy
 - Please include your registration number in the subject line of the email.
- ☒ Activate your university account:
 - You will receive an SMS with your personal username for accessing the University's online platforms.

- ☒ - Pay the tuition deposit: Settle the semester tuition deposit as outlined in your offer.
- ☒ - Please ensure you retain the proof of payment for your records.

Course Registration and Semester Commencement


All first-year distance learning undergraduate and postgraduate students are automatically enrolled in their courses. No action is required on your part for the Fall Semester 2025.

For subsequent semesters, course registration will be conducted in consultation with your Programme Coordinator.

Upon course registration, please:

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Log in to the Extranet portal using your credentials to confirm your course selection: extranet.frederick.ac.cy
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Access the LMS platform to find your Fall Semester 2025 course content under the “My Courses” tab: lms.frederick.ac.cy/login/index.php
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Complete the Introductory Course DLICS100 on the LMS, which will help you to:

 - Understand the University regulations governing your studies
 - Familiarise yourself with the services and digital tools offered by the Distance Learning Unit
 - Complete the self-assessment questionnaire at least two weeks after the commencement of the semester

Orientation Week: Seminars & Workshops – September 2025

Information Session with the Distance Learning Unit

During this session, staff members of the Distance Learning Unit will explain how distance learning programmes operate at Frederick University. The presentation will cover key academic procedures, relevant regulations, and the structure of distance learning. You will also be introduced to the digital tools and platforms used in online learning, along with guidance on how to use them effectively.

Workshop: Using the University Library and Referencing Tools

This interactive workshop will guide you in locating credible and reliable academic sources and teach you how to cite them correctly. You will also be introduced to the plagiarism detection software Turnitin, including how and when to use it to support your academic integrity.

Meet Your Programme Coordinator and Administrative Officer

This session will give you the opportunity to meet the Programme Coordinator and the Administrative Officer responsible for supporting your programme of study. You will receive essential information about your curriculum, programme structure, and academic expectations, along with practical advice for successfully managing your studies.

Information Session on Student Services and Support

As a distance learning student, you are entitled to access all student services offered by the University. This session will provide an overview of the available support, including the Counseling Centre, Mobility Office, Career’s Office, and the Studies Office, highlighting how each service can support your academic and personal development.
